This volume contains 28 portraits of MGH scholars of Jewish origins written by authors who are themselves medieval scholars and in many cases engaged in continuing the scholarly research as those about whom they are writing into the $21^{\text {st }}$ century. The biographies reveal the many challenges Jewish scholars faced, ranging from systematic prejudice to persecution and murder under Nazi rule. At the same time, it becomes clear what important contributions they made to the editions of German medieval sources published by the MGH since 1819. In this volume, their achievements receive their due recognition through the appraisal of 26 authors. While a number of the scholars, such as Philipp Jaffé, Ernst Perels, or Richard Salomon, would have protested against being labelled as Jewish, their lives and careers were nevertheless affected to a greater or lesser extent by the common experiences of anti-Semitic discrimination, persecution and emigration. The volume begins with an introductory survey of the development of anti-Semitism in the $19^{\text {th }}$ and $20^{\text {th }}$ centuries with a focus on academic circles, revealing its social, political, and ideological backgrounds. An impressive study on the fate of Jewish scholars at the Bavarian Academy of the sciences and humanities under Nazi rule, broadens the scope of inquiry with revealing insights into the history of this closely affiliated institution.
